🛄 Course Description

This course is designed to enable the student to understand and apply the fundamental concepts and procedures of both financial and management accounting. Topics include basic accounting terminology, financial statement analysis and interpretation, internal control, ethical issues in accounting, cost behavior and cost volume profit analysis, budgeting, and the use of accounting data in making informed, ethical decisions.

回 Course Objectives

Objectives are defined as what the course will do and/or what the students will do as part of the course.

By the end of this course, students will have gained knowledge and competency to do the following: 1) understand the importance and usefulness of accounting information to both internal and external users; 2) understand how various transactions affect reported financial results; 3) understand and communicate using basic accounting terminology; 4) demonstrate understanding of cost behavior and apply that understanding to perform cost-volume-profit analyses; 5) understand budgeting basics and how budgets are used to evaluate performance; and 6) evaluate costing methods used for business decisions.

You will need the Cengage software and a textbook (e-text will be sufficient). You will also need a calculator (a financial calculator is strongly suggested).

When purchasing your materials, you will have Cengage Unlimited available to you. This is a product where you can buy a Cengage bundle for several months now and have access to all Cengage products in the future, depending on the number of months you purchase. This may be a good deal for you, since

your Fin 3400 text is also a Cengage product that utilizes the Cengage MindTap software.

⇐ Technology Requirements

This course includes an online homework and assessment manager called CNOW. Cengage CNOW is a teaching and learning platform that is proven to deliver better results for students. It empowers students by continually adapting to deliver precisely what you need, when you need it and how you need it, so your instructional time is more engaging and effective.

When accessing Canvas and Cengage CNOW it is important to have good internet connectivity and the proper browser. CNOW is best used with Google Chrome and will automatically communicate with Canvas. This means all your work in Cengage will automatically download into Canvas for scorekeeping. Canvas is your main system; Cengage CNOW is an auxiliary system where you will do your homework and take chapter quizzes.

This course also includes recorded instructor videos using Kaltura Express Capture for each lesson plan. These videos can be found in the Media Gallery or in the chapter modules.

Students may be required to use word processing and Excel in addition to Cengage CNOW and Canvas. Computers and software are available on all Lake-Sumter campuses in the libraries and the learning centers for student use. Therefore, lack of home computer access is not an acceptable reason for missing class deadlines. To ensure consistency for students, the APA 7th edition is required for all research papers.

Canvas provides technical support. If you are having problems with Canvas, you can call the Canvas Support Hotline at 1-844-803-6622. Or in Canvas, look for the Help tab and click on it. The tab should be on the lefthand side of the screen. You will be given guides that might help resolve your problem. Methods of Evaluation

Students are evaluated on a point system where points are earned through the completion of the following: discussions, possible essays, homework assignments, quizzes, extra credit, and exams.

Your grade in this course will be determined based on the percentage of total points earned. Each assignment is assigned a point value. The assignments in the course include homework and quiz sessions in Cengage CNOW, and discussions, possible essays, homework, extra credit, and exams in Canvas.

Criteria

Communication:
