- Critique and analyze the inspirational and motivational focus behind human artist creativity within the historical scope and artistic tradition applied toward critical analysis and evaluation of art works.

Course Objectives:

Objectives are defined as what the course will do and/or what the students will do as part of the course.

- Analyze and evaluate Western Art in chronological order from Pre-History to the Twentieth century i.e., prehistoric, ancient, medieval, renaissance, modern art, present-day art.
- Analyze social, religious, geographical, and historical influences on the development of Western Art.
- Recognize and identify major artists and works as related to periods and styles of art.

• Describe the basic tools and principles of art.
